

Public Disclosure: University of Arizona Voluntary Resignation of Accreditation Effective: August 1, 2023

University of Arizona in Tucson, Arizona, voluntarily resigned its accreditation with the Higher Learning Commission, effective August 1, 2023.

The institution's status as an HLC accredited institution expires on the effective date above. The institution has indicated that it plans to maintain its accreditation through another federally recognized accrediting agency beyond that date.
